

*This series of cards, the product of an unknown publisher, reissues cards published by Cowles & Casler of Canada and Caroga Lakes. None of the Canada Lake cards belong to the original eight Rotograph series, but are the additional series of five cards showing a

steamer trip down the lake. The production numbers show that the Caroga and Canada Lake cards were printed as a series. The earliest postmark is 1911. These cards were likely printed in the United States, after the introduction of the tariffs imposed on German imports in 1909. The quality of the printing is clearly inferior to the Rotograph cards.
