## **CLCA Lake Management Committee Reports**

June 17, 2023 Director's Meeting: Mary Jablonski, VP

**Environment and Ecology** Dave Graves, Chair Report given at the meeting.

Water Level / Flood Control Henry Eifert and Bill Fielding, Co-Chairs The water level issues will be discussed at the meeting. Also, the water levels taken daily, by Bill and Henry, for Canada Lake and the Stewarts Landing Channel, are posted on the canadalakesconservationassociation.com website. Look under Lake Issues for' Water Level 'Info. It's an amazingly detailed diary that's kept up to date! Importantly, it provides the DEC in Northville, with updated accurate information, to assist them with the regulation of the flow of the Stewarts Landing Dam, if they access the site.

Fire Safety Rick Fink - Chair Report given at the meeting.

Water Purity John Byrnes - Chair At last year's Annual CLCA Meeting, in July, 2022, the CLCA had a speaker from the New York State Federation of Lake Associations, (NYSFOLA), address the programs they have, which assist local lake associations determine water quality, by providing education, information exchange of data findings from lake samples sent to them, and collaboration efforts. More information will be shared at the June 17th, 2023 Meeting, about reports from NYSFOLA and the Adirondack Watershed Institute (AWI) and the Adirondack Lake Assent Program (ALAP), as to the quality of the Canada Lakes in 2022.

Invasive Species Lorrie Mott - Lake Steward, ISC Co-Chair Randy Fredlund - Lake Inspection, ISC Co-Chair The 5:30-7:30AM slots for volunteer Lake Stewards, are not fully filled. These times are important as many people fishing, launch their boats early in the morning, before the West Lake Boat Launch Steward arrives to work. Lorrie Mott expresses the need for MORE VOLUNTEERS. On April 20, 2023, an Invasive Species Committee Zoom Meeting was held, facilitated by Lorrie Mott and Randy Fredlund. Eight CLCA Members and representatives from East and West Caroga Lakes, Peck Lake, Pleasant Lake, and the Stoner Lakes, attended. There were a total of 18 attendees. Lorrie and Randy presented summaries and data, from the activities at the West Canada Lake Boat Launch, Caroga Campground Boat Launch, and the Caroga Boat Washing/Decontamination Station from May 28, 2022- October 10, 2022. There was much discussion among the attendees about invasive water species protection strategies used in the lakes that were represented. The plan, is for the communication and collaboration among the Lake Associations to continue. Continuing educational outreach to area boaters, including school aged children, is believed to be one way of increasing awareness, knowledge, and personal involvement regarding protection of the lakes from invasive species infiltration.

**Lake Safety** Bob Baker and Brian Franz, Co-Chairs Important repeated information for all boaters: Brianna's Law, the name of the NYS law signed into effect by Andrew Cuomo, in 2019, is a comprehensive boater education law, requiring ALL operators of motorized watercraft, to

obtain a boating safety certificate, after completing a boater safety course, by 1/01/2025. - All Jet ski/PWC (Personal Watercraft) operators must be currently certified regardless of age. - All power craft operators regardless of age, will need a boating safety certificate by 1/01/2025. On line course schedules can be found on the following website: www.safeboatingamerica.com. -The West Caroga Lake Association is offering a Boaters' Safety Course at the Caroga Lake Volunteer Fire Station on July 15th this summer. Reservations can be made by contacting the West Caroga Lake Association. There are only a few places left to reserve. I googled the Association, and the NYS Boaters' Safety Course is noted on the initial page. Discussions were held at the CLCA August Directors' Meeting regarding the idea to purchase buoys notifying boaters of the 5 MPH Speed Law, within 100 ft. of the shore and possibly buoys requiring "No Wake Zones." The Safety Committee of the CLCA recommends the purchase of official lighted orange and white regulation buoys that say, "5 MPH" to deploy at the entrance to Lily Lake and the London Bridge channel. Rick Fink is donating a buoy he has, and the current recommendation is to purchase one other such buoy. DEC has the option to approve the placement of these buoys. The CLCA would be required to obtain annual permits for the buoys and be responsible for their maintenance. Further discussion on this topic, will take place at the June 17th Meeting. In the summer of 2022, there were 2 times the Fulton County Sheriff and or a DEC En-con Officer, patrolled the Canada Lakes. It is noted that Sheriff Richard Giardino, recently reported in the Leader Herald Newspaper, that there are limited available sheriffs to patrol the many lakes in Fulton County. This unfortunately reduces the enforcement of boating safety on all local Lakes. The Fulton County Sheriff has been contacted, to request at least 2 patrols, during the current summer, and preferably, a sheriff's presence on a weekend.

**Stewardships** DEC forms need to be filled out this summer by all volunteer stewards of the Nick Stoner Island, the Kane Mt. Fire Tower and trail, and the NYS DEC controlled campsites on the Canada Lakes. These forms provide insurance coverage by the DEC, for volunteers.

**Adopt A Highway** - Bob Baker, Chair On May 6, 2023, there was a Town of Caroga, Town Wide Highway pick-up, which included the stretch of highway the CLCA is responsible for, to pick-up and remove trash. Dates for future Highway pick-ups, will be set as the season progresses.

**Campsites** - Betsy Cannon, Chair Sites will be checked soon.

**Fire Tower** -Marcus Harazin, Temporary Chair; Permanent Chair Position is vacant. Volunteer steward forms will need to be filled out by any members volunteering as Forest Fire Lookout Association Fire Tower Stewards. This association works in conjunction with the DEC. More will be discussed at the June Directors' Meeting.
