THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

The arrival of the 1965 camping season enables me to provide a progress report that includes a few major successes, some unfinished business, a few setbacks, and some unanswered questions.

Membership - The impossible was achieved in 1964 when Herb Steinkamp and his Membership Committee broke another record by enrolling 194 members in the C.L.P.A. This exceeded by 30 the number that were paid members in 1963.

Zoning - A vigorous effort was made to obtain favorable zoning legislation for the area immediately surrounding the Canada Lakes and Green Lake. This effort included a resolution and petitions to the Town Board as well as several meetings with them. The Town Supervisor has reported this Spring that he and the members of the Town Board definitely favor the adoption of zoning regulations which would be favorable to the property owners on the Canada Lakes. He further stated that work has been started on such regulations and that additional progress will be forthcoming as soon as certain legal matters can be satisfactorily reconciled.

I urge you to continue to express your interest in zoning when you come in contact with members of the Town Board. Our persistent interest is necessary and we will continue to have an active Zoning Committee.

Sailing - Interest continued to grow last summer in regard to sailing. The Sunday races not only drew additional entries but were anxiously awaited by many spectators. A more detailed report on the results of the 1964 sailing season is included in another part of this publication.

Card Party Luncheons - A total of about 125 women attended the three card party luncheons that were held in 1964. Ethel Theisen will continue to serve as chairman for this summer. She invites the continued interest of all women in this enjoyable and successful activity.

Dances - A disappointing amount of interest was exhibited in the two dances held last summer. In spite of good music and an increased effort to publicize the events, attendance at both dances was quite poor. Your Board of Directors has decided to conduct only one dance this year. It is their hope that increased emphasis on a single party may serve to concentrate interest and attendance.

All members are encouraged to provide ideas or help that in some way may increase the success of this activity.

Buoys - As most of you know, Paul Montgomery will no longer be residing on the lakes and thus we have lost a faithful Buoy Committee worker. Skeet Sliter, Bill Dunstan, and Varnum Harris have been asked to select and purchase new buoys which will be easier to install and maintain than those that have been used in the past.

These markers are an important navigation aid on the lakes. We have had considerable problems with people who tamper with these buoys. Many of the buoys have been removed entirely or moved from their correct location.

I wish to enlist the cooperation of all C. L. P. A. members in attempting to bring this unlawful action under control. Please inform the Navigation Inspector or any officer or director of this association if you become aware of persons who are tampering with the buoys. A united effort to maintain these safety markers is necessary so that we may prevent a serious mishap.

New Activities - There have been several suggestions offered as to new activities that the C. L. P. A. might consider sponsoring. Among these are: an association cook-out or barbecue; a bridge tournament; increased teen-age activities; a newsletter listing items that are for sale, wanted, lost, found, etc.

Let me repeat - these are only ideas. They need workers to implement them if they are considered to be worthwhile. I would be happy to hear your reaction to some of them.

Finale - By the time you receive this copy of The Echo, the Nominating Committee will be working to provide a slate of officers who will be elected at The Annual Meeting.

It has been an honor to have served as your president for the past two years. The opportunity to meet and work with many fine people has been one of my greatest rewards. I wish to thank my fellow officers and the Board of Directors for their help and continuous support. I particularly want to thank my close friends for their criticism and encouragement.

In conclusion, I wish to express my gratitude to the entire membership for your confidence and willingness to have me serve in this important office. I will look forward to serving the Canada Lakes Protective Association in other ways, for many years in the future.

NEWS FROM THE TOWN BOARD

Mr. Charles Putman and the Town Board have made copies of the 1964 Town of Caroga Financial Report available to members of the C.L.P.A. A copy is available for examination by contacting any officer or director of the association.

A decision has been made by the Town Board against the presentation of a referendum to the voters on the matter of purchase of the Royal Mt. Ski area. Their decision was generally based on the feeling that it would not be a desirable acquisition for the Town of Caroga.

Maps and layouts for a nine hole addition to the Nick Stoner Golf Course are nearing completion. It is expected that a referendum for construction of the addition will be presented to the voters in the Fall of this year.

Some progress on the matter of zoning has been made. Additional details on this topic are included in the president's column.
