

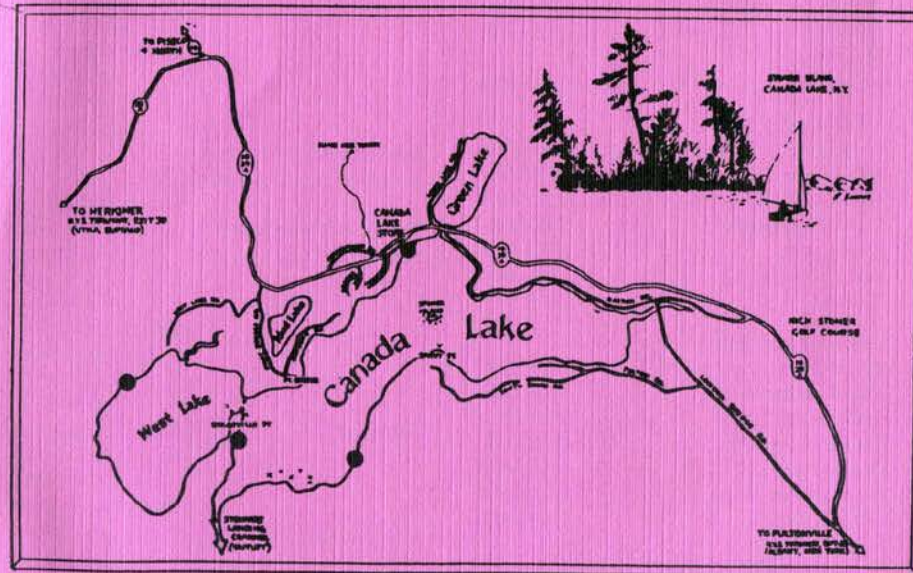

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

At its most recent meeting, the CLPA Board of Directors unanimously voted to extend Honorary Memberships to Bill Dunstan and Edgar Moore. Bill was the 1st President of the 'reformed' Association in 1952, and was on its Board until 1969. One of the originators of the Sailing Club, he was Commodore for 16 years. Last year's *Echo* contained an article of Bill's recollections of 'The Early Years' of Canada Lakes Sailing. The 1992 *Echo* also featured Edgar E. Moore's unique memories and descriptions of the North Bush Church. Although he left the lakes in 1975, Edgar Moore has been a regular contributor to the *Echo* and has preserved valuable pieces of local history and colorful anecdotes for generations to come.

Preservation of a tangible part of our local history — the Kane Mt. Fire Tower — is an undertaking your Directors are investigating with D.E.C. officials. A look at page 16 of the August issue of *Adirondack Life* will indicate that we are not the only group with such an objective, and that public interest/pressure is having an impact on State policy concerning the plight of some fire towers in the Adirondack Park.

Best wishes for a safe and sunny summer.

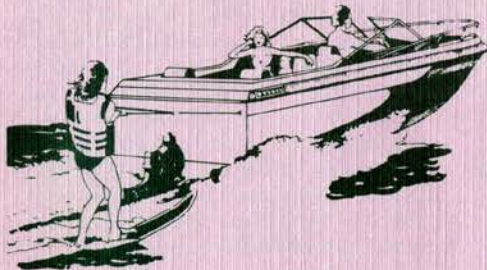

Family updates from the FREEMANS:

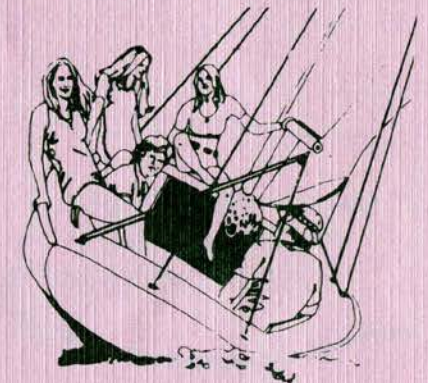

July 15. Christopher Shaw, a noted Adirondack folk musician and storyteller will play guitar and sing, 7:30 pm in the barn.

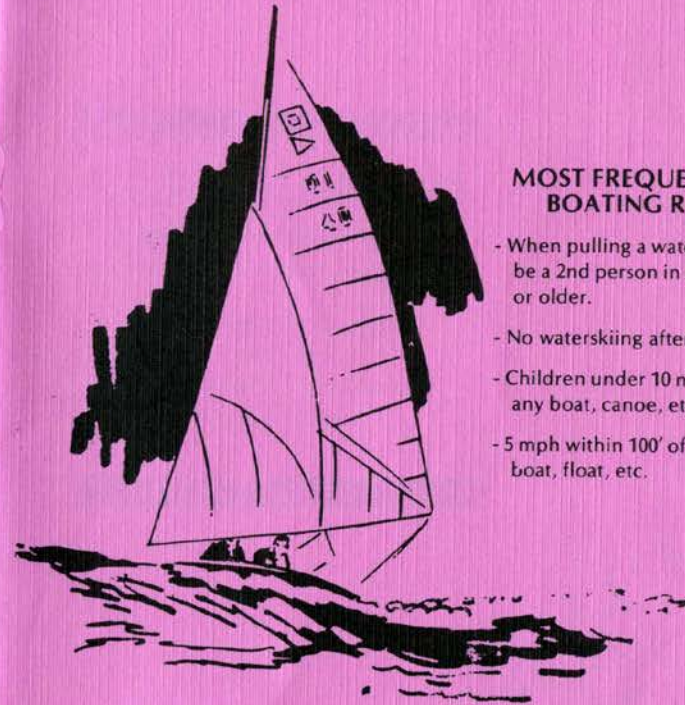
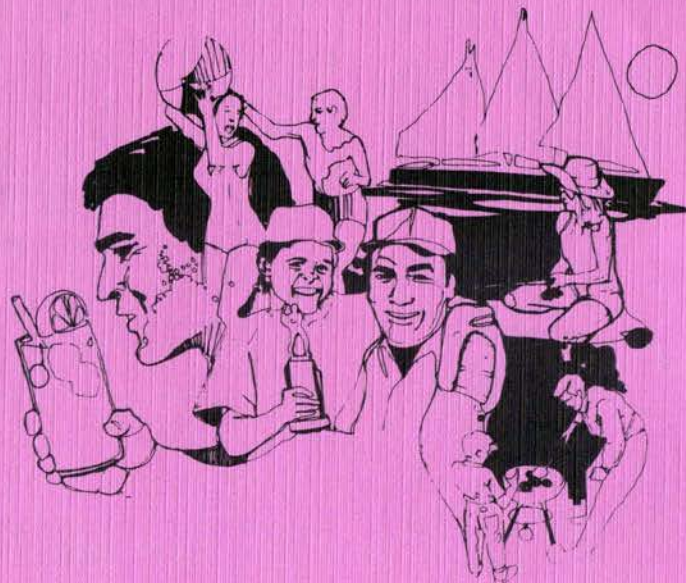

BOATING REGULATIONS**

- When pulling a waterskier, etc., there must be a 2nd person in the boat who is 10 years or older.
- No waterskiing after sunset.
- Children under 10 must wear a life jacket in any boat, canoe, etc.
- 5 mph within 100' of shore, dock, anchored boat, float, etc.
